This past weekend, the Speaking Bobcats of Ohio University attended the American Forensics Association National Individual Events Tournament hosted by the University of Wisconsin - Eau Claire.

Senior Dan Glaser led the team to a 12th place finish by earning a National Championship in Impromptu Speaking as well as awards in three other events. In addition to his individual awards, Glaser placed 8th in Individual Sweepstakes, making him one of the top 10 speakers in the nation.

Junior Ted Dacey was a semifinalist in Persuasive Speaking and a quarterfinalist in Extemporaneous Speaking.

Sophomore Nadine Ajaka was a quarterfinalist in both Prose Interpretation and Dramatic Interpretation.

And the freshman team of Adam Cesarz and Ryan Tinlin were quarterfinalists in Dramatic Duo.

These awards clearly show the range and depth of talent on our team and put us in a good position for the NFA National Tournament next week.

As a reminder, Ohio University plays host to the National Forensics Association National Tournament on April 15-19. This event will bring together more than 800 people from 80 colleges and universities from across the country for this 5 day event. The event is free and open to the public.
